Format: This antibody has been pretitered and quality controlled to work on formalin-fixed paraffin-

 $\mbox{\it embedded}$ as well as acetone fixed cryostat tissue sections. No further titration is required.

Specificity: This MAb recognizes a single chain, transmembrane, heavily glycosylated protein of 90-

120kDa, which is identified as CD34. On the basis of differential sensitivity to degradation by specific enzymes, epitopes of monoclonal antibodies to CD34 are classified into three main categories, class I, class II and class III. It is a class II antibody whose epitope is resistant to neuraminidase but sensitive to glycoprotease and chymopapain. Anti-CD34 labels > 85% of

angiosarcoma and Kaposi's sarcoma, but with a lower specificity.

Background: CD34 expression is a hallmark for identifying pluripotent hematopoietic stem or progenitor cells.

Its expression is gradually lost as lineage committed progenitors differentiate. CD34 is a marker of choice for staining blasts in acute myeloid leukemia. In addition, CD34 is expressed by soft tissue tumors, such as solitary fibrous tumor and gastrointestinal stromal tumor. Its expression is also found in vascular endothelium. Additionally, it appears that proliferating endothelial cells

express this molecule more than the non-proliferating endothelial cells.

Species Reactivity: Human, Cynomolgus Monkey, Rhesus Monkey. Does not react with rat, sheep, cow and dog.

Positive Control: KG-1 cells, Tonsil, or Angiosarcoma

Cellular Localization: Cell surface

Titer/ Working Dilution: No further dilution is required. Microbiological State: This product is not sterile.



Procedure:

- 1. **Tissue Section Pretreatment (Highly Recommended):** Staining of formalin fixed, paraffin embedded tissue sections is significantly enhanced by pretreatment with Citrate Plus (ScyTek catalog# CPL500).
- Primary Antibody Incubation Time: We suggest an incubation period of 30 minutes at room temperature.
 However, depending upon the fixation conditions and the staining system employed, optimal incubation should be determined by the user.
- 3. **Visualization:** For maximum staining intensity we recommend the "CRF Anti-Polyvalent HRP Polymer (DAB) Lab Pack" (ScyTek catalog# CPP125, see IFU for instructions).

Precautions: Contains Sodium Azide as a preservative (0.09% w/v).

Do not pipette by mouth.

Avoid contact of reagents and specimens with skin and mucous membranes.

Avoid microbial contamination of reagents or increased nonspecific staining may occur.
