Specificity: This antibody recognizes a protein of 145kDa, identified as CD117/p145^{kit}.

Background: CD117 is found on a wide variety of tumor cells including follicular and papillary carcinoma of

thyroid, adenocarcinomas from endometrium, lung, ovary, pancreas, and breast as well as malignant melanoma, endodermal sinus tumor, and small cell carcinoma. However, anti-CD117 has been particularly useful in differentiating gastrointestinal stromal tumors from Kaposi's sarcoma, tumors of smooth muscle origin, fibromatosis, and neural tumors of the GI tract. Anti-CD117 is also useful in recognizing myeloblasts in bone marrow biopsy and clot section.

Species Reactivity: Human. Others not known.


Positive Control: Gastrointestinal Stromal Tumor (GIST) or testicular germ cell tumor. Melanocytes in the basal

layer of the epidermis and mast cells in the dermis of normal skin.

Cellular Localization: Cell surface and cytoplasmic

Titer/ Working Dilution: Immunohistochemistry (Frozen and Formalin-fixed): 0.5-1 µg/ml

Microbiological State: This product is not sterile.







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Uses/Limitations: Not to be taken internally.

This product is intended for qualitative immunohistochemistry with normal and neoplastic formalin-fixed, paraffin-embedded


tissue sections, to be viewed by light

Formalin-paraffin human gastrointestinal stromal tumor (GIST) stained with CD117; Clone 3117/370.

Procedure:

- Tissue Section Pretreatment (Required): Staining of formalin fixed, paraffin embedded tissue sections is significantly enhanced by pretreatment with Tris-EDTA HIER Solution (10X) pH 9.0 Plus (ScyTek catalog# TES500).
- Primary Antibody Incubation Time: We suggest an incubation period of 30 minutes at room temperature.
 However, depending upon the fixation conditions and the staining system employed, optimal incubation should be determined by the user.
- 3. **Visualization:** For maximum staining intensity we recommend the "UltraTek HRP Anti-Polyvalent Lab Pack" (ScyTek catalog# UHP125, see IFU for instructions) combined with the "DAB Chromogen/Substrate Bulk Pack (High Contrast)" (ScyTek catalog# ACV500, see IFU for instructions).

Precautions:

Contains Sodium Azide as a preservative (0.09% w/v).

Do not pipette by mouth.

Avoid contact of reagents and specimens with skin and mucous membranes.

Avoid microbial contamination of reagents or increased nonspecific staining may occur.
